Accessibility

OCAC is committed to making learning accessible to all students. Awareness of students' needs and goals helps to create an atmosphere in which learning and making can occur.

Student Services provides reasonable accommodations to ensure that students with disabilities have access to OCAC and its programs and services in order to meet federal requirements, encourage personal growth, and increase effective communication.

Services

All requests for services based on disability are evaluated on an individual, case-by-case basis, and are contingent on the student's self-report and an initial interview with the director of student services, and documentation. Therefore, there is no way of guaranteeing what services or accommodations are eligible until having met with Student Services.

Some students may simply want the security of knowing that they are eligible for certain accommodations, but may choose not to use them in every class. Once eligibility has been established, the student determines whether to use the accommodations or not.
